

# 2019 Brings Progress and Transformation

**WE ARE NEARLY HALF** way through 2019, and it has been an eventful year. I will touch on a few of the highlights.

The city is growing and transforming both in the commercial and residential sectors. There is redevelopment occurring within the city, and we are once again getting ready to annex large parcels that will provide opportunities for new housing. As laid out in my 2019 budget, we are laying the groundwork for a much-needed public works building and hope to complete the planning stage soon and begin building by the end of 2020.

Earlier this year we spent two days in Olympia seeking funding for three major projects: Jones/John Liner Corridor, the Varcor Processor, and the Library.

The Jones/John Liner Corridor project provides an alternate route which will mitigate traffic from the continued development of housing up Hwy 9, and anticipated increase in traffic as redevelopment continues at the SWIFT Center. This project is key to our growth and development as a city. We will have an update on this exciting project in the next issue of *City Scene*.

The installation of the Varcor Processor (Sedron Technologies) into our Waste Water Treatment Plant will generate a positive environmental impact, while eliminating the cost of trucking and disposing of class B bio-solids. The Varcor Processor will produce dry class A bio-solids. Look for an article about this exciting technology in the summer issue of *City Scene*.

*We send our gratitude to Senator Wagoner for all he has done for Sedro-Woolley and our Library.*

The Library is on track and on budget. We went out for bids in April, and plan to begin construction in June 2019. We expect the project to take 10 months to complete. This winter we boldly went back to the Legislature seeking funds that could greatly enhance the already beautiful library and the premium services that will be offered there. We send our gratitude to Senator Wagoner for all he has done for Sedro-Woolley and our Library.

The city and the Rotary Club have always been good partners and are now working together on a remodel of the

Community Center. This process will occur over three years and in three phases: first phase replaces floors, adds storage rooms, fresh paint, and replaces windows on the south wall with french doors that will open out to a new patio and Memorial Park. The second phase entails updating the kitchen, and the third and final phase will involve a restroom remodel.

For the first time in several years, and under my leadership, we have added much needed employees to our highly efficient but stretched workforce. In addition to eight paramedics in the Fire Department, the Police, Solid Waste, I.T., Finance, and Planning departments have, or will soon be adding, employees. With development and growth happening in the city and pushing the corporate limits even further north, it was necessary to strengthen our departments and provide them with the support they need to deliver dedicated service to you, the citizens of this innovative city.

The snow left all of us wondering if spring would ever arrive. Our Street crew worked many hours manning the road, including 63 hours of overtime. As the snow began falling Super Bowl Sunday (February 3), crews were out sanding and plowing from then until February 15. In all, there were about 12 days of snow and ice control. Crews laid down approximately 100 cubic yards of salt/sand mix before the county cut us off, but that didn't deter our Street Crew; about 75 cubic yards of plain utility sand without any salt added, was applied to the roads. I am grateful for all that our Street Crew has done and continues to do for all of us here in Sedro-Woolley.

On behalf of the city and myself, I thank you for your continued support in the improvement, achievement and success we are experiencing here in Sedro-Woolley.

## ENTERING TOWN VIA WEST STATE STREET IS GETTING BETTER BY THE DAY.

The paving project from last fall is nearly complete with final striping to happen soon. The railroad tracks that used to jiggle our teeth loose are gone and

the city is working with BNSF to take a similar approach on Ferry Street. The Downtown 48 is complete and fully occupied. The library project is underway with construction planned to begin in June. Additional sidewalks will connect downtown to West State. The old Marketplace building which was a nuisance and an eyesore for more than a decade, is sold and is being remodeled to reopen as a grocery and retail site this summer.

Even with the recent loss of our long-time Ford dealership, it is hard not

to be excited and enthusiastic about Sedro-Woolley's future. Downtown is vibrating with anticipation for what's next – I think we are near to achieving critical mass that will launch our downtown into a new state of vibrancy.

Sedro-Woolley Downtown Association is on the cusp of accreditation which will allow for more stable funding to continue to support downtown events, activities and revitalization.

The city's construction industry is as busy as ever with projects underway all over. In the next year, the city expects to add approximately 300 new residential lots as multiple plats work their way through the approval process.

# Sedro-Woolley Businesses Stand the Test of Time

**WHILE TOURING FOLKS** around from the Economic Development Association of Skagit County (EDASC) showcasing some of the changes in town, we stopped by Oliver – Hammer Clothing Shop and heard some

colorful stories from Dyrk Meyers and his partner David Drummond. These stories inspired me to focus in on some of our town's long standing business successes.

Oliver Hammer has been in our community for 98 years and is the oldest continuing business. *"They have a lot of good stuff but the customer service is what stores and restaurants should strive for.*

*Always friendly staff and super helpful."*

(recent Yelp review). It is a refrain often heard throughout the businesses in town, but only a few have stood the test of time. Oliver Hammer first opened in 1921 as a partnership between Joe Oliver, an Italian tailor who for years fitted everyone from loggers to businessman in

their Sunday suits, and George Hammer for whom the town square is named. While David talked about how the transition from suits to outdoor wear was a wise move, Dyrk spoke of how Pinky Robinson and his father Greer learned a lot about merchandising from J. C. Penney's where both had worked. Pointing out that while Penney's is long gone, Oliver Hammer is still here, selling locally, nationally and even internationally.

Sedro-Woolley Auto Parts owned continuously by the Huggins family

celebrated its 80th year in 2018. Lemley Funeral Chapel established by Harold V. Lemley, serving Sedro-Woolley and all of Skagit County since 1935, is a third generation family operated funeral home.

Rothenbuhler Engineering, a privately owned and operated engineering and manufacturing company producing sophisticated electronic products for mining, logging, military/law enforcement and other demanding environments was founded in 1946. Snelson Companies, Inc. operates as a pipeline construction company and it offers pipeline, station and facility construction and gas services in the United States. Snelson Companies was also founded in 1946.

So what other businesses have stood the test of time? Founded in 1914, the Sedro-Woolley Chamber of Commerce hosted social gatherings and promoted a healthy business climate for its members. Today's Chamber goals are much the same as they were in 1914, its mission today: "Partnering with the community to promote business."

The Soroptimists are celebrating their 70th year. This organization operates the Walnut Tree which helps support scholarship programs; Sedro-Woolley Rotary was chartered in 1922; and Skagit Bank (now Banner Bank) has been in existence for 61 years. The North Cascades National Park opened in 1968, United General Hospital in 1964, Cascade Fabrics in 1941 and Skagit Surveyors has been here for 40 years!

We can only hope that with dedication, hard work and that Sedro-Woolley "can-do" attitude, our new businesses will be thriving in 2119.

# LOCAL OFFICES UP FOR ELECTION

**CANDIDATE FILING WEEK IS MAY 13-17, 2019.** For residents of Sedro-Woolley, several elected positions will be on the ballot this fall including mayor, city council, school board and hospital board positions. All of these positions are non-partisan.

The Sedro-Woolley City Council has three positions on the ballot as well as the Mayor, each are four-year terms: Ward 1, Ward 4 and Ward 5. City Councilmembers meet on the 1st, 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month at 7:00pm and are paid \$500 per month. The filing

fee for each of these positions is \$60. The mayor's position is part-time but often requires more hours during the week as well as weekend and evening engagements and all council meetings. The mayor is paid \$28,307 per year; the filing fee for mayor is \$283.07. Candidates for positions representing wards must live in the ward, candidates for mayor must reside anywhere in the city's limits (the city council ward map is below).



The Sedro-Woolley School District has three school board positions on the ballot, each are four-year terms: District 2, District 3 and District 5. The school board meets on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month at 7:00pm There is no filing fee for these positions. Candidates must live in their director district (see the school director map to the side).

Hospital District 304 (United General Hospital) has two commissioner

# Sedro-Woolley's Park Caretaker Program

**E**lected officials and staff at the city of Sedro-Woolley are always striving to provide public services in the most cost effective and efficient ways possible. In this article I'd like to highlight the unique approach that city owned parks are managed. Sedro-Woolley's city parks system currently includes 112-acres of developed and undeveloped park land spread across 12 city parks. There are six public restrooms, five picnic buildings, a dog park, four playgrounds, three basketball courts, two volleyball courts, two baseball diamonds, a skateboard park, a soccer complex, two R.V. parks, an amphitheater, and a community center. The total area of all these facilities combined is


approximately the same size as Disneyland, and yet there are only 1.5 (FTE)'s full time equivalent maintenance employees currently assigned to parks maintenance. In order to adequately maintain these facilities, the work of full-time staff is supplemented by resident park caretakers at three of the city parks. Park caretakers receive a small monthly stipend and are provided with a city owned residence at the park. As part of their job, the caretakers live at the park and are required to assist with supervising the use of the park, clean and stock restrooms, perform safety inspections, open and close park gates, and report needed repairs to staff. Riverfront Park has had a caretaker since the park opened in 1984. A caretaker was added to Bingham Park in 2014, and a picnic building at Memorial Park was converted to a caretaker residence in 2015.

Having resident caretakers at our city parks has greatly reduced the amount of vandalism, and has allowed the city parks system to continue to grow while minimizing the pressure on full-time city staff. There are current plans underway to



expand the caretaker program by adding a fourth position at the future Olmsted Park, located at the entrance to the SWIFT Center, (formally known as Northern State Hospital).

As a collection specialist, my primary job is to make sure all the sewer pipes are flowing to the wastewater treatment plant. This is accomplished by cleaning the pipes with a vac truck and inspecting them with closed circuit TV equipment. I also assist with plant operations where the dirty water goes through treatment and is turned into clean water before being discharged to the Skagit River.

I enjoy my job and the people I work with. I have two beautiful daughters and when I am not at work I enjoy hunting, fishing, anything outdoors and of course, spending time with my family.

# The 2019 Construction Season is Here!

THE CITY OF SEDRO-WOOLLEY ENGINEERING and Public Works Department is busy preparing for the 2019 construction season. This article reviews the various projects planned for this season.

## ■ SR20 WEST LANE WIDENING AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

This project will add a center turn lane to State Route 20 from Holtcamp Road to Hodgkin Street, and a new creek crossing to serve the planned Skagit County Behavioral Health Stabilization Campus. The project is expected to begin construction in early July.

## ■ 2019 BORSETH-ROBINSON SEWER EXTENSION PROJECT.

This project will extend improvements constructed in 2018 on West Bennett, West Nelson and Batey Streets. The project will provide gravity sanitary sewer service to this previously unserved area. This project will begin construction in August.

## ■ 2019 SIDEWALK AND ADA RAMP UPGRADE PROJECT.

This project will upgrade sidewalks and pedestrian ramps at various locations citywide. Major portions include the west side of 3rd Street from State to Warner, State Street High School, Murdock Street from State Street to Ferry Street, the south side of Woodworth Street from Murdock to Metcalf, plus ramp improvements at various other locations including the Sedro-Woolley High School and State Street High School. Pedestrian crossing signals are planned on State Route 9 at McFarigle and on State Street at the State Street High School. The project is expected to begin construction in July.

## ■ 2019 OVERLAY AND CRACK SEALING PROJECTS.

The 2019 Crack Seal Project will apply asphalt crack sealant on Portobello Street, Arrezzo Drive, Orth Way, Cultus Mountain Drive, Trail Road and East State Street from Township to the east city limits, plus a few isolated sections of city streets. The 2019 Arterial Overlay Project will provide a thick overlay on Wicker Road from Township to the east city limits.


## ■ 2019 CHIP SEAL PROJECT.

The city in partnership with Skagit County will be chip sealing N. Ball Street from Hwy 20 to Evans Dr., Orth Way, Murdock Street from Northern Ave to SR 20, Northern Ave from Puget to Township, and 6th Street from Talcott to Jameson. Work will begin around June finishing up in August.

## ■ WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT IMPROVEMENTS PHASE 1.

This project will add a bypass line to the plant process piping between the headworks and the oxidation ditch, as well as modifying the grit tank box and performing repairs to the air lines to Digesters 1 and 2. Construction is planned for March through April 2019.

Additional information on these projects and other projects in the planning stage is available on the city's website at: [ci.sedro-woolley.wa.us/departments/engineering/projects.php](http://ci.sedro-woolley.wa.us/departments/engineering/projects.php). Press releases will be provided before and during construction to inform the public of the construction schedule and traffic revisions anticipated during construction. The city is also jointly planning in coordination with the Washington Department of Transportation a public open house to review city and WSDOT planned projects for 2019. Details on the Open House will be provided when available. Questions may also be addressed to the Public Works Department at (360) 855-0771.



For nearly eight years, I've had the honor of serving on the City of Sedro-Woolley Planning Commission. I've heard it referred to as "Planning Committee", "Council", and "Building Committee", but my personal favorite is an exchange that often goes like this: "Eric, you're on the...committee...with the city...". "The Planning Commission?" "Yeah, that one!" Sometimes it can feel like we're the forgotten, younger sibling to the City Council. But I get it. We run a low profile, are not elected, and deal with tantalizing topics such as zoning code and design standards. So if you're not too familiar with Planning Commission, don't feel bad. I wasn't sure what it entailed until I was approached by former Mayor Anderson to apply. The Planning Commission is made up of seven members (or Commissioners). We are appointed by the Mayor with the approval of City Council and work in tandem with both entities.

I currently serve as Chairman and work alongside Pat Huggins (our Dean of the Commission), Danielle Freiburger, Stacy Penno, Joe Fattizzi, Joe Franett and Silas Maddox. I want to highlight these individuals, along with our city staff, Planning Director John Coleman and Jo Ann Lazon, all of whom are diligent and take great care in their responsibilities. I would be remiss if I did not also mention our former colleague, Lynda Tilley, who tragically passed away recently. Her dedication, friendly spirit and love for our community will be greatly missed on Planning Commission.

Statutorily, Planning Commissions are empowered to serve as the investigative body for the city through the use of inquiries, public hearings, discussions and analysis of data. From this process, we make recommendations to the City Council. Furthermore, we review and amend necessary land use regulations and zoning codes to ensure that development within the city limits and urban growth area is considerate of the environment and the city's economic goals. All of this is a painstaking process, which sometimes takes numerous iterations, before we make any recommendation.

The annual review of the city's Comprehensive Plan, which is the governing document that lays out the vision and

goals by which we want our city to grow, is one of the work programs that the Commission is tasked with. At the beginning of each year, we open it up to the public to submit updates to the Comprehensive Plan, which helps set our docket for that year. Currently, we are working to develop standards for an Urban Village Mixed Use Overlay. This designation would allow for a mixture of commercial and residential development that is pedestrian-friendly, has relatively high design standards, and allows for varying residential densities.

We do not take these responsibilities lightly; we understand regulations that we recommend have a direct impact on property owners. There have been a couple of packed house public hearings in the course of my tenure. Public input is great! In fact, as an investigative body we function best with it! So, I invite you to attend our meetings, held every third Tuesday of the month, and let us know what you think. We look forward to seeing you there!

# Sedro-Woolley School Community is Key to Student Success

**A KEY GOAL IN THE SEDRO-WOOLLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT** strategic plan is to ensure responsible allocation of re-sources to maximize student learning. During the past five years, the school district has enjoyed

a healthy general fund balance while adding additional classroom support that includes music, art, special programs, and the expansion of programs and services at every elementary school, as well as the middle and high schools.

In addition, the Sedro-Woolley School District has successfully completed the implementation of the safety and technology capital levy by providing needed

security measures at all of our school facilities as well as establishing one-to-one computing in all of our schools. This levy has been retired, reducing the local school tax rate.

The school district has also sustained an aggressive schedule of maintenance and repairs at our facilities that include projects such as painting, roof repair, HVAC repair, and ADA compliance. We are fortunate to have a skilled maintenance staff to make these needed and

ongoing repairs, saving the district from escalating construction costs.

Being good stewards of district resources is a primary goal outlined in the school district’s strategic plan. We have a great school system with an outstanding staff serving our children. We currently have a historically low local levy and bond rate below \$2. Recent examples of being good stewards include the Cascade Middle School renovation and replacement that came in on budget and on time, as well as the safety and technology capital levy that significantly upgraded security measures in every school facility.

However, the school district does have major project needs including roofs, boilers, and window replacements in several of our schools. The district is experiencing enrollment growth resulting in the addition of portable classrooms at most of our school sites. The cost for these types of projects can be as high as \$1.5 million each. To address major projects, the district has established an ongoing facilities committee that is meeting bi-monthly. The charge of the committee is to deter-

mine next steps as it relates to asking the community to support a capital levy or attempting another capital bond to replace Evergreen Elementary. The committee will also create a long-term plan to accommodate student growth and aging facilities.

A recent article in the Skagit Valley Herald highlighting the City of Sedro-Woolley “growth spurt” confirms what the school district is experiencing. The City of Sedro-Woolley has amazing leadership with Mayor Julia Johnson leading the charge of renewal, especially as it relates to establishing a “more vibrant community.” As partners, the city and school district complement each other well. We have worked together to provide safe walking routes, transportation upgrades, and safety measures in our schools.

The Sedro-Woolley School District will continue to work with our community partners for the benefit of our students. And we will continue to be good stewards of community resources because we believe that “community is key to student success” in order to have a great school system.



# Tough Old Broads

**THE FORESTS WERE SO DENSE**, so thick and the trees so tall that daylight couldn't reach the ground. Traveling in the area was made more difficult due to the lack of roads – only trails along the river bank. A huge log jam in the river meant a canoe, as the only means of travel, had to be portaged.

There was no running water, sewer or garbage pick-up, and no electricity; cooking, laundry, etc. were done in the river or stream, or from water carried in buckets back to home.

There were no stores close by; the only place to buy supplies was at Ball's Landing in Sterling.

Often the men would leave for days to go to Mount Vernon or beyond. The women were left to tend the homestead. They had to keep a fire going, gather wood, fill the lamps, cook from scratch, garden, get water from the river, take care of the children if they had any, fire a gun if necessary, and milk the cow, which many if not all homesteaders eventually acquired. There were days, sometimes weeks when there was no one else to talk with.

The women during this time had to be tough to survive and adjust to a life of hard work and being lonely, otherwise they simply left or died.

The Sedro-Woolley Museum celebrates the Tough Old Broads and highlights their struggle to survive and help shape the future of upper Skagit County. These ladies had to make it in a man's world. Like the Quackenbush sisters, who helped open the lines of communication


between Sedro-Woolley and Marblemount; Dr. Georgina Batey, who came to this area from San Francisco, and helped settlers on horseback and delivered babies; or Minnie Von Presentine's life as a pioneer woman, and her struggle to carve out a life for her family, and endure a pregnancy which was not for the faint of heart. And let us not forget Nona Cook, who as a young girl of 15 left the fashionable society of a big city, was thrust into the remoteness of Skagit County and was often left alone to defend the homestead.

These ladies became teachers, were responsible for starting churches, organizing ladies' societies and so much more. These tough ladies made a difference.

So much has been written about the men in this area who homesteaded, but there's unfortunately not a lot about the women.






